IDENTIFY KINGSPORT'S TREES

Master Gardener Mike May is working with "Keep Kingsport Beautiful" and the City of Kingsport Tree Committee to conduct an inventory of the approximately 9,000 trees inside the city. The inventory will be entered into a database and utilized to monitor the number, types, condition, etc. of trees inside the city limits.

Initial plans call for a 4-hour training session on Feb. 3, 2007. Then, three person teams will proceed to conduct the inventory in 11 designated territories inside the city beginning in February and ending in May 2007.

Approximately 75 volunteers will be needed to conduct the survey. This is an ideal MG project and it has been submitted for approval for 4 CEU and whatever service hours are performed.
