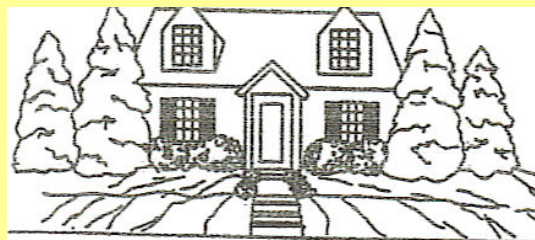
### March NETMG Program: Landscape Design

Kenneth P. Soergel will be conducting a program on Landscape Design at our Tuesday, March 14 meeting, to be held at the Gray Community Center. (Refer to directions above for January meeting).

Ken is currently a resident of Jonesborough and holds a BSLA from Pennsylvania State University and MLA from Harvard. He was an Adjunct faculty member in Landscape Studies at Chatham College, Pittsburg and was Associate Professor in Landscape Horticulture for 13 years at University of Maryland. Ken has 25 years professional experience as owner/manager of design build/maintenance landscape company and has been a registered Landscape Architect since 1969.

Ken presented his Landscape Design program to the Fall 2005 Master Gardeners class and it was very

popular with class members. Interest was expressed in additional Landscape Design classes. If a minimum of 10 (or more?) members at the March meeting are interested in continuing these sessions, then a sign up and 2 additional sessions may be added. The 2 additional classes would be conducted the last 2 weeks in March. ## Chris' Corner

Another year of growth for the Northeast Tennessee Master Gardener Program! Thanks to each of you, we were able to document 5975 ACE hours and 1475 CEUs. These ACE hours are valued at \$101,575.00, using the rate per hour given by a national volunteer organization. Being able to report this impact to our legislators goes a long way in keeping our funding. Keep up the great work!

There has been some confusion about "ACE" hours and CEUs. Remember, "ACE" stands for administrative, community, and education. Administrative is any type of hour involving Extension programming, including the MG program; community is any type of hour that directly benefits the community; education is any type of volunteering where you are involved with the preparation or implementation of an educational program.

CEUs are continuing education units. These are accrued at the rate of 1 CEU per 1 hour of formal instruction. This includes any type of formal educational program, including tours and sit-down programs. Self-guided tours or other types of self-guided instruction such as magazines, books, internet programs, etc are not eligible. Many CEU opportunities are available within the Tri-cities area. Examples are SAPS programs, garden center programs, MG training classes, NETMGA programs, and horticultural tours.

Lists of volunteer and CEU opportunities for 2006 are available upon request. For 2006, at least 50% of your ACE hours should come from projects listed on the volunteer opportunities list. If you have a question about a volun-

teer project or educational program not listed currently, then call me at 423-279-2723.

In the past year, there have been some hours reported for ineligible reasons. The following are such examples:

- Personal lawn and garden work
- Lawn and garden work for neighbors
- Mowing the church lawn

Remember, volunteer "ACE" hours should benefit the community in some way. They should also educate the community. Ornamental beds around a church or community building have been questioned, but I realize they serve the MG program well by establishing a good rapport with the community. With these projects, let's strive to incorporate an educational component by identifying plants, by utilizing the garden for some type of educational program, or other educational emphasis.

The certification officer for NETMGA is Juana Quinones. She compiles the hours making it possible to report the hours to the state coordinator. Hours may be submitted on the paper report form or entered online on the website, [mastergardener.tennessee.edu](http://mastergardener.tennessee.edu). If you enter the hours online, I suggest you keep your paper record as the website is still experiencing some difficulty. If you prefer to send the hours in via the paper report form, then you may either send it to me or to Juana. She may be reached at 423-245-3469. Keep in mind the deadline of September 30, 2006 for hours. I would also encourage you to submit hours periodically throughout the year instead of waiting until September.

Remember, the reporting of hours allows a formal documentation of the program in terms of an actual dollar value. So, keep sending in those hours. If you have any questions, call me at 423-279-2723.
